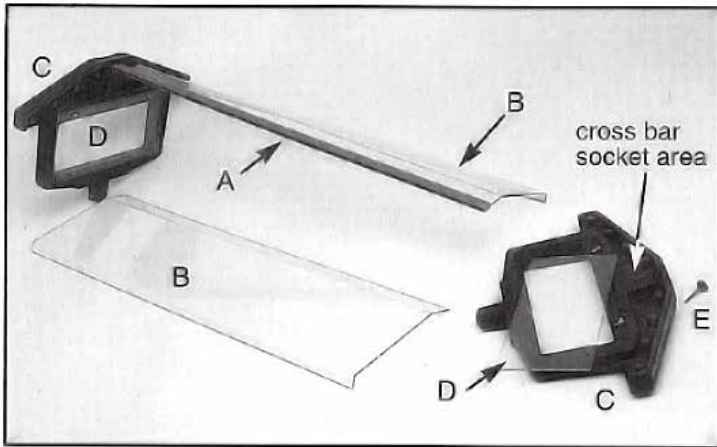


# ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

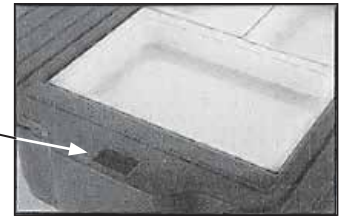
## FOOD BAR SNEEZE GUARD



### Sneeze Guard Parts List:

- A. 1 - gray extruded cross bar
- B. 2 - acrylic top panels
- C. 2 - uprights
- d. 2 - acrylic end panels (already assembled on uprights)  
End panel, 2 nylon bolts for each panel.
- E. 2 - cross bar thumb screws tighten the assembly to each end
- F. 2 - 5/2" hex bolts and 2 - washers.  
(not shown on picture)

### Sneeze Guard Assembly Instructions:

1. Place uprights in the socket recesses at both ends of the food bar body.
2. Place the gray extruded cross bar between the uprights in the cross bar socket areas.
3. Insert cross bar thumb screw through the hold at the top of each upright and into the threaded end of the gray extruded cross bar. Turn only enough to engage threads. Repeat at other end.
4. Slide an acrylic top panel into the upright setting on the pegs at one end while allowing the upper edge of the panel to enter along the groove of the gray extruded cross bar. With cross bar thumb screws still loose, gently pull the second upright outward allowing the acrylic panel to slip onto the pegs on the upright. Keeping the cross bar thumb screws loose, repeat the operation for opposite panel.
5. With both panels in place, tighten both cross bar thumb screws until hand tight.
6. Place hex bolts (5/2") with washers through hole located on the bottom of each side of the food bar body and thread the hex bolts into the base of each upright. Tighten with the wrench provided.

### Cleaning Instructions:

- A. Acrylic Panels:** Wash the panels with warm soapy water and rinse thoroughly. Dry with soft cloth or soft paper towel. (Never use alcohol, i.e. Windex, abrasives, any type of solvent, or acetone.)
- B. Food Bar Body:** Steam clean or wash with warm soapy water and a plastic or bristle brush. (Never use a metal brush or abrasive cleaners.) Scrub with brush, wash down and rinse thoroughly with clean water. If staining occurs, any standard destainer such as Dip-it, works well.
